MILK FOR BUTTER IN WINTER.
Dairy maids should remember that milk, in order to flourish, must have a certain temperature. Where a thermometer is the index, about seven degrees will be found the most desirable temperature for cream to rise in cold weather. It will not do to put milk in the cellar at this season of the year, because it is most likely to ferment with vegetables and fruit. No good butter can be made when milk is exposed to the effluvia arising from vegetables. When new milk has been strained, place the pans or, if you please, the tin pail, on the stove and warm the milk. The cream will soon rise, and the cream will be rich and sweet.

KEEPING FOWLS IN WINTER.
Brooders should understand that nothing is gained by letting fowls shift for themselves in the winter. They need the best of care, and will pay tenfold in the end for the trouble. Let regularity be observed in feeding, and above all things do not fail to supply them with plenty of good pure water. Do not trust to their getting their supply of water from the snow—you might as well debar cattle the use of water, because there is plenty of snow upon the ground as fowls. Keep henneries warm and dry, and supply them with sand, burnt oyster, and clam shells, and coal ashes. Feed with good wholesome food—corn, wheat, screening, and buckwheat. Give them meat once a week, and they will "shell out" early in mid-winter and pay the trouble. Recollect, nothing is made by a "nackleshif" care of fowls in cold weather—it's poor economy.—Rural New Yorker.
