PROPOSED AMENDMENT OF THE CON-

STITUTION OF PENNSYLVANIA.

Joint Resolution Proposing an amend-

ment to the Constitution of Pennsylvania.

It is enacted by the Senate and House of Rep-

resentatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania,

in General Assembly met, That the following

amendment to the Constitution of this Com-

monwealth be proposed to the people for their

consideration, pursuant to the provisions of

the tenth article thereof, to wit:

SECTION 1.

Article of the Constitution, and insert in lieu there-

of the following:

Article of the Constitution, shall be chosen by the

qualified electors of the State, at such times and

places, and in such manner as shall be prescribed

by law.
