

WAR AREA EXTENDED BY THE ENTRY OF TURKEY AND BY THE OPERATIONS OF THE FLEETS



There has been a great addition to the area of war through the entry of Turkey as an ally of Germany and Austria. On land there are the Franco-Belgian battle line, two hundred and fifty miles long; the Russian line, from the Baltic to the Carpathians, six hundred miles long; the Serbian line in Bosnia, ninety miles long, and now a fourth line of sixty or seventy miles, where the Russians have pushed across the border of the Caucasus and occupied several Turkish towns. In the North Sea an English fleet is protecting the left of the battle line in Belgium, while patrols are looking out for German mine layers in the open waters and in the Atlantic toward Iceland. The German fleet has its base behind Heligoland and German war ships are reported at the Aland Islands, in the Baltic. The Russian Baltic fleet is in the Gulf of Finland and Russia has another fleet in the Black Sea off Odessa. The Turkish fleet is at Constantinople and in the Sea of Marmara, while British and French war ships are bombarding the Dardanelles forts and the Adriatic port of Cattaro, and the Austrian fleet is bottled up at Pola.
