BOLDS KLEIN & COMPANY IS LIABLE FOR ALL DEBTS

COURT HOUSE

Against Directors of the Concern to Compel Them to Pay Majority

Alleging that the directors of Klein & Co., formerly a Market square firm dealing in latines' furnishings, before going into the hands of a receiver, contracted debts far in excess of the company's authorized capital stock, \$10,000, Job J. Conklin, bankruptey trustee of the concern, has brought an equity suit against them to recover such amounts for which they may be held liable.

W. K. Meyers, counsel for the trustee, in the statement filed, makes a demand on the directors to produce evidence showing what portion of the capital stock was paid in, who paid it and to whom it was paid. The company's indebtedness is fixed at \$26,771.85. Of the authorized capital stock, it is contended, only \$1,000 was paid in and that the directors are liable for the debts in excess of that sum.

The directors are given thirty days in which to make answer.
