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Since it is part of their act, "The Volunteers," a quartet of really delightful entertainers, are supposed not to be on the bill at the Orpheum, yet they provide one of the best of the week's offerings. After Billy Gripps appears on the stage and in song laments the fact that he must perform all alone, he calls for volunteers and Al Rauh, "the boob," joins him from the audience; Jerome Daley, "the stage hand," from behind the scenes, and Fred Lyon, "the leader," from the orchestra. The singing of the four is excellent and comedy is not lacking to add to the entertainment.

Emma Carus has brought her distinct personality to bear on the success of the new bill and is especially good in her Tipperary parodies. Her partner, Carl Randall, is a dancer worth seeing. The couple do the only dancing in the show, and bear the responsibility very satisfactorily.

Bert Fitzgibbon, "back again where the squirreis" liget him," is eccentric above all, and for that reason funny; his singing is good, but his acting is better. The playlet presented by Edward Esmonds and company is familiar to theatregoers, and, although not a line seems to have been changed, it is still as pleasing a piece as it was at former presentations at the Orepheum. The ease with which one can recall almost every action in the play serves to show how well the acting is done by the two performers.

Russell Mack and Blanch Vincent give a song sketch at the piano, the Kramers do gymnastic stunts, and the Welling Levernig Troupe, in their comedy cycle act, bring the show to a close with a whirl.
