

ELABORATE MUSICAL PROGRAMS ARRANGED FOR EASTER SERVICES

Resurrection Day to Be Greeted With Songs at Sunrise Ser- vices

COMMUNION IN MANY CHURCHES

The Rev. B. H. Hart will preach his last sermon at Fifth Street M. E. and the Rev. W. W. Hartman his first at Ridge Avenue M. E.

The observance of Easter will open in many local churches to-morrow with sunrise services, according to custom. At the other services of the day there will be Easter music and appropriate sermons. There will be Holy Communion in many instances, and also reception of new members.

The Rev. B. H. Hart, pastor of the Fifth Street Methodist church fourteen years, will give his farewell sermon there to-morrow. He leaves to become pastor of the Pine Street Methodist church, Williamsport. At the Ridge Avenue Methodist church the new pastor, the Rev. William W. Hartman, who comes here from Tyrone to succeed the Rev. John H. Daugherty, will give his first sermon there since his appointment.

B. F. Eby will teach the lesson to the Young Men's Bible class of the Redeemer Lutheran church, Nineteenth and Kensington streets, to-morrow morning at 9:30 o'clock, when the class will hold its Easter service. The men will attend the evening service at the Redeemer church in a body.

Their hearts leap forward to some unknown spiritual possibility as the Easter dawn appears once again.

And what is the joy and what is the hope which the Easter greetings speak, and which are borne into countless millions of hearts with a fragrance of flowers, the uplift of sweet melody, the alleluja and the prayers of Christians this glad Easter morning?

It is the joy over the fact that the first Easter morning brought an unique victory for all mankind, a victory over man's last and greatest enemy, and the hope that because that victory was won for man once it belongs to man forever.

Because of the Easter hope and the Easter joy men are surely, even if slowly rising in the scale of spiritual living in a world which is more and more coming into the Christ spirit, whether men are willing to acknowledge it or not.
