## SENSATIONAL MOVEMENT IN BETHELEHEM CONTINUES

Steel Stock Jumps From 103 to 115. Then Back to 109—Individual Transactions Very Large in Lots of 100 to 200 Shares

New York, April 9.—The sensational movement in Bethlehem Steel was continued at the beginning of today's market, trading in that stock being of the most feverish character. The opening transaction was a block of 2,000 shares at 110 to 107; its closing price yesterday being 105. From 107 it fell by easy stages to 103 and gradually reascended to 115, then back to 109. Individual transactions were very large, but the total output in the first 15 minutes was a little over 2,000 shares, mainly in lots of 100 to 200. The balance of the market showed some uncertainty at first, but soon grew strong under the lead of United States Steel, Reading and other favorites. Most shares were up to 2 to 4 points.

Highly favorable trade reports issued by the Treasury Department and circumstantial peace rumors were the chief influences back of the market, which gathered greater strength and activity after the first hour. Transactions in the morning approached half a million shares. U. S. Steel contributing a very large part at a maximum gain of 3 points. Other leaders advanced 1 to 2 1/2, and specialties, particularly motor shares, continued their progress to record-breaking prices. Bethlehem Steel was temporarily relegated to the background, but toward midday again became active on a rising scale. Bonds were firm.
