WEEKLY BANK CLEARINGS

Bradstreet's Figures for Last Week in Harrisburg and Other Cities

Bank clearings in the United States for the week ending April 2, as reported to Bradstreet's Journal, New York, aggregate \$3,395,260,000, against \$3,004,606,000 last week and \$3,270,938,000 in this week last year. Canadian clearings aggregate \$110,997,000, as against \$118,347,000 last week and \$150,784,500 in this week last year.
