BILL ABOLISHING CAPITAL PUNISHMENT HAS A FLAW

It Amends the Hanging Law Which Has Been Repealed in Favor of Electrocuting, and It Must Be Changed Before Committee Can Act

The Geiser measure introduced in the Pennsylvania House of Representatives for the abolition of capital punishment and making the punishment for murder imprisonment for life, is yet in the hands of the Judicial General Committee, which finds that it will have to be amended before it can be reported.

The Geiser measure recalled to members of the Legislature to-day the fact that some weeks ago hundreds of little green paper slips were distributed in the legislative halls protesting against the abolition of capital punishment.

The green agent of the Civic Alliance cites statistics to show the effect of capital punishment and its abolition. It says that in 1912 Oregon, Ohio, Arizona, Massachusetts and Vermont voted against the abolition of capital punishment.
