APPROVES \$1,000 TAX ON TRADING STAMP COMPANIES

The Walton bill providing for the county licensing of trading stamp concerns, was passed in the House last night by a vote of 146 to 17. The tax, which would probably be prohibitive, is \$1,000 annually for the stamp or coupon companies and \$150 annually for the merchant handling stamps.

TO GIVE GOVERNOR TIME TO PASS ON APPROPRIATIONS Governor Brumbaugh and Chairman Woodward, of the House Appropriations Committee, after agreeing yesterday that the appropriation bills must be held within the estimated revenue of the Commonwealth, decided to hold them to within ten days of the close of the session in order that the Governor may have thirty days after the close of the session to act upon them.
