TO RAISE FUNDS FOR NEW CAMP CURTIN M. E. CHURCH

More Than Two Hundred Men and Women Will Next Week Endeavor to Get \$38,000 to Erect Building On Historic Ground
A movement to be city-wide in its appeal, will be the Silver Jubilee Celebration of the Camp Curtin Memorial M. E. church next week.
General chairman, J. A. Haas, announces the committee which will forward from April 19 to 27, in an effort to raise \$38,000 for a new church building which will occupy the present site and front the old Camp Curtin for the last twenty-five years.
The citizens around Old Camp Curtin who are recipients of the influence of the church and who consider the Camp Curtin church as the community center, started the project.
General chairman, J. A. Haas, announces the committee which will forward campaign during the eight days.
In the men's division there are twenty teams of five men each, each team being headed by a captain.
The women's division of 100 women is organized likewise.
This committee of over 200 will call upon the people of the community, members of other churches in the city, citizens of the community who recognize the worth and influence of the church and who regardless of their church affiliation or whether they have any or not, will be likely to support the project.
