"WIFE WILL GET ME NOW," WORRIED THIS HUSBAND. George Simpson Now Is More Concerned About Wife's Suit for Maintenance Than He Is About Penitentiary Offense.

Waynesboro, April 17.—When George Simpson, who was arrested here and later lodged in jail at Chambersburg was advised that he is wanted by the Adams county authorities on a horse-stealing charge, he let it be known that he is not so much concerned about that criminal charge as he is about the one in which his wife is the prosecuting witness.

Simpson repeatedly remarked "now my wife will get me." Last fall his wife appeared against him in the York county courts in a maintenance suit and on his promise to make regular weekly payments he was released on his own bond.

Sheriff Thompson, of Adams county, is patiently awaiting release of Simpson from the Franklin county prison so that he can take the defendant to Gettysburg to answer to the horse-stealing charge on which Simpson and one Claude Groat have been jointly indicted.
