BIG WHEAT CROP FOR KANSAS **PAVING OF DERRY STREET** Year's Yield Will Nearly Equal Record Harvest of 1914 Topeka, Kan., April 23.—Another WILL START NEXT WEEK

Topeka, Kan., April 23.—Another bumper Kansas wheat erop in 1915 was predicted by J. C. Mohler, secre-tary of the State Board of Agriculture, in a report made public yesterday. The condition of the 1915 crop he es-timated at 32.8 per cent. on a total acreage of 8,586,300. A y ir ago the crop estimate was 96.5 per ant. on an 8,580,000 acreage. A wheat crop second only to the 181,000,000 bushels yield of 5 t year is indicated, Mr. Mohler asser-d. It is pointed out that, based on a 100 per cent. crop of 20 bushels to the acre, Kansas, under existing conditions, should this year produce 159,700,000 bushels. 
PARIS SOCIETY HAS LOST 1,500 KILLED IN THE WAR


