TURKS SINK FIFTH BRITISH BATTLESHIP IN THE STRAITS

London, May 28.—The first day of Arthur J. Balfour's administration of the Admiralty was marked by another heavy British loss in the Dardanelles. The Admiralty announced the torpedoing and sinking of the battleship Majestic in the straits. The statement follows:
