The News Condensed.

The liberal successes in Great Britain have caused a feeling of uneasiness in the German capitol.

The House Friday concurred in the Senate amendments to the Star Service bill.

A cyclone passed over a portion of Kansas Friday evening. At Girard several buildings were blown down, many people injured and several killed.

Six hundred French Canadians have left Montreal during the past week, for the United States and Manitoba.

S. B. Sturdivant, of Wilkesbarre, has been nominated as Supervisor of the Census for the Fifth district of this state, vice Jadwin rejected.

The general committee of the Irving Hall Democracy, at New York City Friday evening elected Abram S. Hewit, chairman.

A meeting in New York the other evening, called to organize an anti-Grant club, tabled a resolution against a third term, and adjourned.

Steinmnn and Hensel editors of the Lancaster *Intelligencer*, and attorneys, have been disbarred for publishing an article reflecting upon Judge Patterson.

The Cabinet after discussing Alaska matters to some extent, decided to recommend legislation looking to the establishment of a civil government for the territory.

William J. Pollock, has been nominated for Supervisor of Census in Philadelphia, in place of Dr. Sherwood. rejected. It is generally conceded that Pollock can be confirmed.

John Swinton, in a letter to Denis Kearney and others, announces that he cannot be the presidential candidate of the National party, because he is not a native of the United States.

Judge Wright, who assaulted ex-Secretary Delano in Washington some time since, was convicted and on Saturday was sentenced to pay a fine of \$1,000 and thirty days imprisonment.

The Dauphin County court adjourned on Saturday until the 26th inst. It is understood if Kemble and his associates appear new bail will be accepted till that time.

Princeton college is to have a new telescope, costing \$28,000. The money to purchase the instrument has been subscribed by friends of the college, Robert Bonner heading the list with a \$10,000 subscription.

The Rev. Dr. William Crawford, of Green Bay, Wis., preached an excellent sermon on whispering in church, reprovving the vice in fit terms. It has been printed and ought to be very useful, for the vice is one of rapid growth and wide prevalence.

The Supreme Court of Michigan, has decided that it is not a violation of the Sunday laws of the State to subscribe money on Sunday to buy a church, or to help to build one. It is a lawful contract if made on Sunday. Such promises may be enforced in the courts of law.

The vote of the House of Representatives to concur in the Senate amendments to the Star Route Deficiency bill, against the unanimous recommendation of the Appropriations Committee, is considered as a declaration that the administration of the Post office Department has been efficient and honest.

The receipts of the American Bible Society for March were \$72,989 94, and the payments \$50,243 11. The receipts for the year ending March 31 were \$608,342 - 28. The number of volumes issued in March was 95,080. The whole number of copies issued from the Bible House during the year, not including those issued in foreign lands, was 1,130,345.
