Of the above indebtedness, \$1,000 is in one order, due Aug. 20, 1881, and the holder is not willing to have it redeemed until due.

In addition to the above assets, there is \$391 84 due from citizens for side walks put | Hay. down by the Borough, not all collectible.

It will be seen by the foregoing statement, that notwithstanding the Borough tax was reduced one half in 1878, and only 12 mills assessed for 1880, the debt has been steadily reduced and the collectible assets are sufficient to pay the further necessary expenditures for the balance of the year, ending March 31st, 1881, leaving the Borough entirely out of debt. This happy state of things is the result of great care by the Council, in counting the cost of proposed new work, not absolutly necessary for the public good, and rigidly enforcing the collection of all taxes on exhibitions, peddlers, &c.

The tax of five mills assessed for the support of the Poor, for the year ending March 31, 1881, is sufficient and will cover all outstanding indebtedness, and should the commissioners be ready to take the charge on the 1st of April next, no further assessments of taxes by the borough for that purpose will be

The usual detailed statement of the receipts and expenditures for Borough and Poor purposes will be published at the proper time.

As frequent inquiry is made of the Borough Treasures as to the public school debt. may be proper for me to add that the Borough government has no jurisdiction or control over the department of Public Schools.
