Hon. John I. Mitchell.

Hon. John I. Mitchell, who was yesterday elected U. S. Senator from this State for six years from the 4th of March, to succeed Senator Wallace, is a native of Tioga County. He was born in 1838, and is consequently 43 years old. He was educated in the common school and at the Lewisburg University, but did not graduate. Before the war he taught school; served in the army as a lieutenant and captain. In 1864 he was admitted to the bar of Tioga County and four years later was chosen District Attorney for three years; for a year or two he edited the *Wellsborough Agitator*; was a member of the Legislature from 1872 to 1876, where he won honorable distinction by his ability, unquestioned honesty and unswerving fidelity to the principles of the Republican party. He was once a conspicuous candidate for the Speakership. He was also chairman of Judiciary General, and Ways and Means Committees, positions which made him the leader of his party in the House.

In 1876 he was unanimously nominated for Congress and elected. Against his wishes he was re-nominated for a second term and re-elected.

During his long experience in public life, he has kept himself above reproach, and has served his constituents at the expense of his own pecuniary advancement, as he is a poor man. To his integrity, uprightness and wisdom as a legislator, he is indebted for his present advancement, as it is no disparagement of his fitness to say that there are other men who have been suggested for the place quite as talented as himself; but he will out rank the average Senator in ability as a debater and legislator. His unanimous nomination and election is creditable to himself and highly honorable to the Republican members of the Legislature. It will restore harmony to the party whose unity had been threatened by the long struggle, as neither faction can claim him. He is an independent, upright man, and in his official capacity will know no parties inside the political organization which has chosen him.

This is the time for great enterprises and the fever of speculation is thoroughly aroused. In the railroad line is the scheme to extend our railwep system into Mexico—General Grant, Jay Gould and others being in the scheme. The reclamation of the Everglades of Florida is another affair of some magnitude, engineered by Philadelphia gentlemen of large means. These are samples of the spirit that is abroad. In the line of mining enterprises the number, good and bad is almost beyond mention. Whether all this indicates rising prosperity, or portends an ultimate panic, is a question to be carefully studied.

Kearney recently made a speech on the Sand Lots in San Francisco, in which he said: "If one thousand Irishmen will subscribe one dollar apiece to pay my expenses to Ireland and back, if necessary I will go there, but will reserve the right to use my own judgment after I get there as to what I shall do." The money is not likely to be raised.

A dispatch from Paris on Saturday to the *London Times* states that the village of Brevieres, in the Department of Savoy Sardinia, has been completely destroyed by two avalanches. Fifteen persons were killed. The damage is estimated at 250,000 francs.


