The potato is a tropical plant, but its tuber producing quality is a northern modification of the plant, and in this quality it is improved by the cool summer of the north, and is successfully cultivated to the arctic circle, and with a decided improvement in the quality of the crop and generally in its yield. The crop is sometimes injured by the intense heat of July and August, even at the fortieth degree of latitude. The tendency of the tuber to degenerate in warm elimates will suggest the precaution of occasionally renewing the crop by planting northern potatoes.
