"The Bishop and clergy of our church have decided to pay no attention whatever to any such law. We are, under our ordination vows, obliged to administer the sacrament in accordance with the law and usages of this church. If we do not do so, we would be stripped of our ministry. We are willing to render unto Cæsar the things which are Cæsar's, but we still give to God the things that are His. I say, as did Peter, 'Judge ye whether we should obey men rather than God.' Of one thing we may be assured. we shall never recognize for a moment the attempts of human legislation to destroy the great sacrament of the Christian church.'

The reverand gentleman and his brethren of the clergy might easily avoid a violation of the law by procuring unfermented wine which is now used by many congregations even where there is no constitutional provision forbidding the use of fermented wine.
