It is not generally known that some of the amber products of our county find a market in foreign lands. Dressed hoop poles are now being shipped from Wilmot township to New York, whence they are sent shoos (in bundles) to Cuba. There they are set up—filled with sugar and many of them returned to the States. The material for the hogsheds is packed in bundles to lessen the bulk and on arrival at the West Indies is put together in short order—everything being in readiness.
