After being burned out there is 1837 he located at the corner of Main and Elizabeth streets, where he continued to do business until he sold out to BRYANT & STULEN in 1867, after a successful and continuous business career of 37 years, and removed to Montrose where he engaged in the mercantile businees with his son-in-law. Old age and infirmities compelled him to retire from the establishment on the first of January last. Mr. Drake was esteemed an honorable busness man, a good citizen a consistent christian, having been a worthy and devoted member of the M. E. Church for many
