MINIATURE ENGINE.—P. M. COOLBAUGH, who runs the engine at JOHNSON & Co.'s foundry, has just completed an engine of diminutive proportions. The boiler, which is an upright, is 2 feet in diameter and 28 inches high; contains 99 flues, aggregating 130 feet of pipe. The engine, to which is attached a pump, is also upright and occupies but little space. The machine was fired up for a trial the other night. The boiler was filled with ten gallons of cold water. In five minutes after the fire was lighted there was sufficient steam to blow the whistle; in 8 minutes the engine was started and in ten minutes the steam gauge indicated 35 lbs. Every stroke of work on the unique little machine was done by Mr. COOLBAUGH just as he could get opportunity to use the tools, but the job is as perfect as it could have been made by a machinist. The engine is to be placed in a small boat to run on the river.
