This comet seems to be the great comet of 1807, and is located in the Constellation of the Dove, Right Ascenion 6 hours and Declination South 30 degrees. It is not visible from this latitude and not known yet that it will be, although it is likely to be as the comet of 1807 was distinctly seen. No apprehension need be had over the unusual appearance of comets during the present year as they do not possess the power to work injury upon the earth or any other planet.


