## Protecting the Widow

The subject of building and savings as sociations on a partly new plan is attract ing attention．In the old associations， vorkingman often has no way of contin aing the monthly payments，and the prop－ rty is seized by the association，which ells it to the highest bidder．Of conrse ly，with six per cent interest，provided the property has not depreciated in value．
The new plan provides for the widow＇
protection by associating with the ol tyle of payment of monthly dues the new eature of paying a small sum additional per share as an insurance fund．This in urance fee enables the society to guar aree to the family of any deceased men－ monthly dues without cost to the widow． children or other heirs，until the societ runs out．Suppose a man has six share on which he pays 86 a month．He also paystwenty cents extra per share pe entire monthly payment $\$ 7.20$ ．At the and of the year he has paid $\$ 14.40$ for his insurance．The society has received it and he，as one of the members，has still his six shares and receives $\$ 1080$ ，for which he purchases a home．If he dies a week after the purchase，the widow at ance becomes the possessor of a home and the building association keeps up the onthly payments．
All members of the society are exam ned by a doctor the same as in any insu rance company．Members between 21 and 55 years of age only are taken．The mean therefore is 38 years．Ordinary fife insurance for $\$ 1000$ for one year in ald line compames on persons 38 years o building association each year．After a building association has been in progres a few years its membershp generally hold about 1，500 shares．Each montl herefore the society receives $\$ 1,00$ lues paid in and $\$ 300$ insurance fund． The insurance fund amounts to $\$ 3,600$ per year．If no one dies that year the amount becomes a reserve fund．If any time a member who has been th goo
standing for any period finds that he can not continue his payments，he call draw out all the money he has paid in tor due with six per cent interest，but his insur ance money he forferts．
