The following new Rule relating to jurors and witnesses was adopted by the Court on Wednesday:

RULE XXXIV.

1. To the end that the due attendance of jurors and witnesses may be better secured, the Prothonotary immediately after calling the general list of Traverse Jurors each day, shall read aloud this Rule, viz:

2. When a Juror fails to answer upon being called into the box, the Prothonotary shall make a note thereof in the court minutes, and the Juror shall not be allowed pay for that day, unless a satisfactory excuse be shown for such failure; and the Court may also, in its dicretion, impose a fine on such Juror.

3. If a witness is not present when called, and his absence causes delay, unless a sufficient excuse is shown, no pay for that day shall be allowed him; and the Court may also, in its discretion, impose a fine on such witness.
