The abundan their wisdom, are still our increasing hertage And if, in parts of our vast domain, some affiiction has visited our brethren in their forest homes, y ner sanctified by the generous compassion for th suffers which has been called forth throughout ou land. For all these things it is meet that the voice of the nation should go up to God in devout homage. Wherefore I, Chester A. Arthur, President of the United States, do recommed that all the peo inst., as a day of national thanksgiving and praye by ceasing so far as may be, from their secular la bors and meetig fing honor and praise to there to join in ascribing honor and praise to Al in our history and in our lives, and offering earnest prayers that His bounties may continue to us and to our children.
