Mice This Winter.-Mice are very prolific; a single pair will often multiply to fity or more during a single season, as the earlier roods reproduce one or more generations. Usually a large proportion of each summer's growth is killed off in winter, if autumn rains saturate the soil. At this writing, the ground is still dry, deep down, in several States. If at anv point the soil freezes solid before $\mathrm{co}^{-}$ pious rains, extra caution should be taken to protect fruit trees and shrubs against mice. The methods we have often described, sueh as banking earth arouad the trees: tramping the snow hard about the trunks as it falls; putting tarred paper 4 to six inches above ground and a little below, etc.-American Aqriculturist for December.
