REMOVE FALSE FRUIT—No fallen, unripe fruit should decay on the ground under or about the trees. Fruit that drops before it is ripe, does so because it is diseased. Insects mature in the fallen fruit, and rise to infect the trees, or leave their larva for another crop of its kind. Fruit growers cannot be too careful in gathering fallen fruit that the grounds beneath their trees do not become insect nurseries—that their orchards do not become swarming households for tribes of insects. This is one of the very best methods to destroy the caterpillar. The grub of the future insect is deposited in these, and of course by destroying them, the number that would appear next season is thereby diminished to a minimum as the work is done.
