**GREAT AUDIENCES  
GREET EVANGELIST**

Rees Describes Twentieth Century Sodom to Attentive Body of Men -- Twelve Hundred Crowded in Last Night and Many Were Shut Out.

When the builders first enclosed the building in which the gospel meetings are being held the query of many a passerby was: "Where do they ever expect to find people to fill it?" The question was twice answered yesterday in the great numbers that gathered to listen to the preaching of the gospel. The great audience of men that assembled at the afternoon meeting practically filled the tabernacle, and the manner in which they sang the gospel songs, and the wrapt attention with which they listened to the speaker both bore testimony to the fact that they were there to worship. Rev. Rees spoke in his pleasing and forceful way of the "Twentieth Century Sodom." He pointed out the location of the various classes of men who are living in the Sodom of today, and appealed to them to move out of the city and seek higher ground.

In the evening twelve hundred people crowded themselves into the tabernacle and many others were forced to turn away. The sermon was from Hebrews 9:27. "It is appointed unto men once to die, but after that the judgment." This was the first of a special series of sermons that are to be delivered this week. After the sermon a consecration meeting was held to which hundreds of people remained. Rev. Rees will speak tonight from the theme: "The City Four Square." On Wednesday an all-day service will be held in the Methodist church.

**DAINES GETS  
LAW'S LIMIT**

Fifteen Years Imprisonment and \$5000 Fine For Brutal Assault on Young Girl.

Thomas Daines, convicted of a most brutal assault on the little Wheeler girl near the State line, July 4, was sentenced to 15 years in prison and to pay a \$5000 fine and the costs of the prosecution Saturday. This is the extreme sentence provided by the law. He will spend the time in solitary confinement, at hard labor, in the penitentiary at Philadelphia. He took his sentence stolidly and said nothing.

Judge Fanning in commenting on the crime said it was exceeded in brutality by only one case in the history of the county—the murder of little Cora Greenleaf in 1875—and that there was no mitigating or palliating circumstance connected with the case.

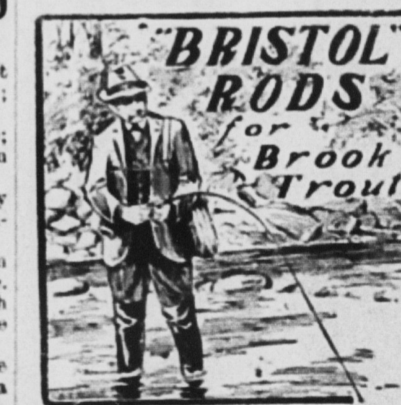
