

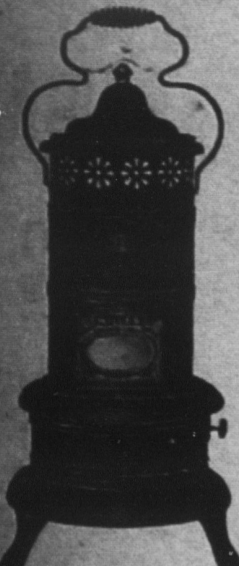

PREPARED PLACE, PREPARED PEOPLE

Heaven, the City Four Square. Subject of Discourse by the Rev. Rees at the Tabernacle Last Night.

Despite the inclemency of the weather a goodly audience gathered in the Tabernacle last evening. The text was from John 14:2. "In my Father's house are many mansions." In presenting the theme Mr. Rees emphasized the fact that heaven is a place, a prepared place, for a prepared people. The character of the prepared place was set forth as the most beautiful and grand of all dwelling places and the character of the people was shown to be those who had prepared themselves for that place by coming up and out of the great tribulations of earth, who have "washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb."

The second sermon in the weekly series will be given tonight from the subject "Is There a Hell?"
