**DID NOT HEAR
DEADLY ENGINE**

**Domiano Fili Fatally Injured by
Backing Locomotive Near the
Round House Last Night—One
Leg Severed, Other Crushed.
Man Died at Hospital.**

Domiano Fili, an Italian laborer,
single, 24 years old, was struck by
an engine that was running back-
ward near the round house last
night, at 7 o'clock, and fatally in-
jured. One leg was severed from
his body and the other thigh was
badly crushed and mangled. He
was taken to the hospital, where
he died about four hours later from
shock and loss of blood, in spite of
all that surgical science could do
for him. The remains were taken
in charge by Undertaker J. W.
Grumme. The funeral will prob-
ably be held tomorrow.
