BOARD OF TRUSTEES GRANTS FRANCHISE

Terminal of Projected Line of Chemung Valley Traction Company Not Involved—Action of Trustees of Purely Local Concern.

Waverly—At a meeting of the village board of trustees held at their rooms last evening the honorable body reconsidered its action in refusing a franchise to the Waverly, Sayre & Athens Traction Company to construct a trolley line in certain streets of this city...

While the granting of the franchise is a victory for the traction company, some things that were asked for were denied. Permission to use Fulton and Elizabeth streets was denied the company. The last named streets is the terminal of the projected line of the Chemung Valley Traction Company which are trying to obtain permission to construct a line from this city to Elmira...
