**FRANCHISE VOTED OVER THE VETO**

Athens Borough Council Refuses to Recognize Reasons of Burgess and Petitions of People in Trolley Matter.

Athens—The regular meeting of the borough council was held at city hall last evening, all of the members being present except Mr. Cheney. The veto message of Burgess Macafee was presented, giving his reasons for withholding his approval of Ordinance 96 granting a franchise to the Athens, Sayre & South Waverly Street Railway company to build their road through the streets of the borough. Petitions were also presented signed by many of the citizens of the borough recommending that the burgess be sustained in his veto. President Weller gave an opportunity for anyone in the room to be heard whereupon Hon. Mial Lilley arose and stated that the persons standing back of the company he represents who were thoroughly responsible and that they were acting in good faith and if they would pass this ordinance to night that they would have an engineer on the route between here and Waverly at once and would go on with the work without unnecessary delay. But if Athens borough sustains your mayor we cannot go on with it and we can not build the road to Towanda as we intended.

Mr. Lilley then stated that the local passenger traffic needed this road for then you could go to Towanda and do your business and return in time for dinner the same day. That the railroads did not provide suitable accommodations for the local passengers and were indifferent as to the needs of the travelling public. In regard to the 5 cent fare, he said, the passengers on the new line would be given transfers to the W. S. & A. cars and they would be taken to the northern limits of their line for one fare. In the matter of bonds they stood ready to give a satisfactory security that the borough would always be kept harmless from any expense or damages arising in consequence of the operation of the road.

Mr. Keeffe then said. Whereas, it appears Burgess Macafee has returned Ordinance 96 without his approval and a petition has been received asking us to sustain him in his veto, therefore I move that the matter be reconsidered.

The motion to reconsider was adopted unanimously, whereupon Mr. Keeffe made the motion that Order 96 be taken up by sections and adopted. On a vote being taken each section was read and passed upon and adopted by a vote of 6 to 1. Councilman Weiss voted no to every section and the remainder voted aye. Mr. Keeffe then moved that the ordinance be adopted as a whole, whereupon Mr. Weiss said:

"I can readily see that this is going through regardless of the veto of the burgess and the petition of the people. You are requested to give away a valuable franchise and there is no evidence or guarantee that the borough of Athens will ever receive one cent in return for it. They tell you that they will pay fifty dollars for every new car they run. This is practically the same corporation as the old line of Waverly, Sayre and Athens street car company. What is to hinder them using the old cars they have been using all the time on the new line. Then you will get nothing from them in this way and the borough will not get a cent in return for the valuable franchise we are asked to grant. We voted the franchise to the W. S. & A. company in 1895 and they have been operating the road to years on our streets and we have not received a penny in return. Are we going to grant similar rights to this company as we did to the other company ten years ago without receiving some guarantee that the people of the borough will be protected in their rights and
