He Charged With Keenan
Athens—Wesley Vanover of Owego has been visiting friends and the scenes of his early youth in this vicinity the past week. He was the youngest of eight children of Henry Vanover, one of the oldest settlers of Litchfield township, whose farm was near Daniel McKinney's. His father carried the mail from Athens to Leraysville, most of the time being obliged to travel on foot. Wesley performed that duty after his father retired in about 1842. Wesley was a soldier in the civil war, serving in Co. G 8th P. Cav. This was the regiment that made the famous charge at Chancellorsville, May 3, 1863, and is immortalized in poetry as Keenan's charge. After the repulse of the 11th corps General Sickles directed Pleasanton to take command of the artillery and the latter hastily collected 22 guns, consisting of his own and the 3rd corps batteries. There was no time to load or aim the guns as Jackson's entire corps were closing in on the routed troops. This charge was ordered to hold the enemy in check until the artillery was in working order. There was but one way to delay Jackson and that was to throw a force of cavalry in front of the pursuing troops, and it was well known that this force would be annihilated. Gen. Pleasanton rode up to where Major Keenan sat on his horse and gave him the order to charge with his 400 cavalry against the 10,000 men who were rushing forward with a yell. To this he agreed and led his men into the gap, himself being impaled on the enemies' bayonets, and half of his men going down in the storm of death dealing missiles. We read of this charge but little realize there are men in the quiet walks of life who took part in them.

Sustained Slight Shock
Athens—W. H. Shaw sustained a slight shock of paralysis this morning. Dr. Cowell was called about 9:30 o'clock and found him in a critical condition. He has had a young colt which he has been exercising, and it is thought this was too much for him. He went to his office this morning but soon realized his helplessness and his wife was obliged to assist him to the house. His left leg and side were affected and he could talk only with difficulty. Mr. Shaw is over 80 years old and one of the oldest Odd Fellows in the county.

Invited to Campfire
Athens—The members of Perkins Post and Union Veteran Legion have been invited to attend the campfire at the reunion of the Tenth N. Y. cavalry survivors in Waverly Thursday evening, Oct. 12 and also the banquet Friday evening. Those cavalry boys were great on the raids among the chickens and porkers in the south, but we fear that their commissary will be bursted quite if they undertake to feed the boys from Athens.
