"Nor shall any newspaper circular, pamphlet or publication of any kind containing any advertisement of any lottery or gift enterprise of any kind offering prizes dependent on lot or chance or containing any list of prizes awarded at the drawing of any such lottery or gift enterprise, whether said list is of any part or of all of the drawing, be carried in the mail or delivered by any postmaster or Missouri Pac....1003. letter carrier.

"The term lottery embraces all kinds of schemes, general or local for the distribution of prizes by lot or chance, such as gift exhibitions, or enterprises, concerts, raffles, or the drawing of prizes in money or property at fairs."

The penalty for violating this law is \$500 fine or 1 year imprisonment or both. The law is being enforced in this vicinity.
