


Made For Attack on Admi Train and His Son.

"Admiral Train has just arrived at Shanghai. The attack on Admiral Train occurred near Nankin while he and his party were shooting. A woman was accidentally wounded by Train's son, but her injuries were slight. The son was detained by the mob, but an amicable settlement was made. The mob afterward attacked the officers, and two Chinese were wounded by civilans. The governor of Nankin apolo-

gized to the officers, restored their guns and punished the ringleaders of the mob. The incident is regarded as closed.'
