NEW YORK, Nov. 1.—Manager Arnold Daly has made the following statement: "I announced in the beginning that I would constitute the dramatic critics of New York a jury to pass upon the fitness or unfitness of 'Mrs. Warren's Profession.' Their verdict has been rendered. It is against the play, and I will stand by my word. I will make no attempt to repeat the performance. Those who have bought tickets will have their money refunded. The Garrick will be dark tonight." It is said that Mr. Daly has spent \$19,000 preparing "Mrs. Warren's Profession" for production.

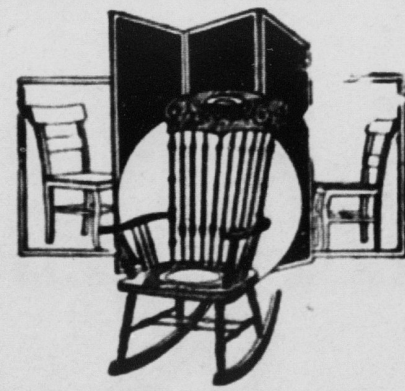

GOVERNOR APOLOGIZED.

Amend Made For Attack on Admiral Train and His Son.
WASHINGTON, Nov. 1.—The incident growing out of the attack on Admiral Train and his son by a Chinese mob near Nankin has been satisfactorily adjusted. The state department has received a dispatch which said: "Admiral Train has just arrived at Shanghai. The attack on Admiral Train occurred near Nankin while he and his party were shooting. A woman was accidentally wounded by Train's son, but her injuries were slight. The son was detained by the mob, but an amicable settlement was made. The mob afterward attacked the officers, and two Chinese were wounded by civilians. The governor of Nankin apologized to the officers, restored their guns and punished the ringleaders of the mob. The incident is regarded as closed."

BELLAIRE, O., Nov. 1.—Sylvester Koudall, aged fifty-two, and seven children were caught by a fall of soapstone in the Maley & Johnson mine, near here, and instantly killed.
