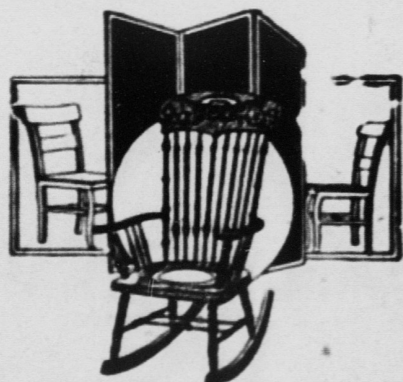

THIEVES RANSACK JOHNSON'S HOME

Break in During Family's Absence and Secure Considerable Plunder—Police Have No Clue.

Thieves ransacked the house of E. H. Johnson on Johnson avenue while the family was absent on a visit. They returned yesterday and when they entered their home found everything turned upside down. Entrance had been effected through a cellar window and the thieves then broke a panel out of the door at the head of the cellar stairs, shot back the bolt, and thus gained access to the second floor. The thieves changed old clothes for a new suit belonging to Mr. Johnson and also took \$16 in old coins from a bureau drawer.

Other valuable articles were also taken and the thieves made quite a valuable haul. The matter was reported to the police but they have little hopes of catching the guilty parties. The Johnson family was absent from home two weeks, during which time the house was alone, and it is not known just when the robbery occurred.
