BIONDI APPEALS TO ROOT.

Sculptor of "The Saturnalia" Makes a Unique Proposal.

ROME, Nov. 7.—Ernesto Biondi, the sculptor, in connection with his lawsuit against the trustees of the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York for refusing to exhibit his group, "The Saturnalia," has addressed a letter to Elihu Root, the American secretary of state, who acted as counsel for the trustees, in which he says he wishes to invoke from Secretary Root an act of justice.

He expresses the hope that Secretary Root will win a great victory over "self" by reconsidering as secretary of state, the judgment, which Biondi calls mistaken and cruel, and he proposes that Secretary Root, being no longer the counsel of his adversaries and therefore no longer bound by professional ties, but being invested with a higher and nobler mission, that of safeguarding the public interest, should act as sole arbiter between himself and the museum, as now through his exalted position Mr. Root may regard things from a different point of view. Biondi will accept his verdict, he says.
