FELL 35 FEET AND SURVIVES
By the Breaking of His Belt Orrin White, a Telephone Lineman, Plunges from a High Pole to the Ground—Will Recover.
Waverly—Just as The Record goes to press this afternoon a long distance telephone call from Ithaca announces a serious injury that happened to Orrin White, a telephone lineman, at 4:30 yesterday afternoon. White was employed by the Ithaca Telephone Company and was engaged in line work at the top of a high pole when his belt broke and he was precipitated to the frozen ground 35 feet below. The unfortunate man struck on his back. Bystanders rushed to his assistance and he was conveyed to his boarding place at 621 West Buffalo street. At first it was thought he was surely killed, but the physician attending him states that he will recover. White formerly lived in Waverly, where he has many friends.

DEATH OF MRS. DUNN
Waverly—Mrs. Charles Dunn, whose residence was 455 E. Broad street, Waverly, died yesterday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Mercy hospital at Wilkes Barre. Mrs. Dunn was operated upon for cancer a few days ago, and while her recovery was confidently hoped for she was unable to withstand the shock. Deceased had resided in Waverly for the past 30 years, was widely known in this vicinity and leaves a large circle of friends to mourn her loss.
She is survived by her husband, four sons, John, Charles, Thomas and William, and four daughters, Mrs. Fred Fahey, Mrs. C. E. Vose, Mrs. O'Heren and Mrs. E. D. Passmore, all of whom reside in this vicinity. She also leaves one sister Mrs. Edward Nevens of Ithaca, and two brothers, John Callahan of VanEtten, and Edward Callahan of St. Louis.
