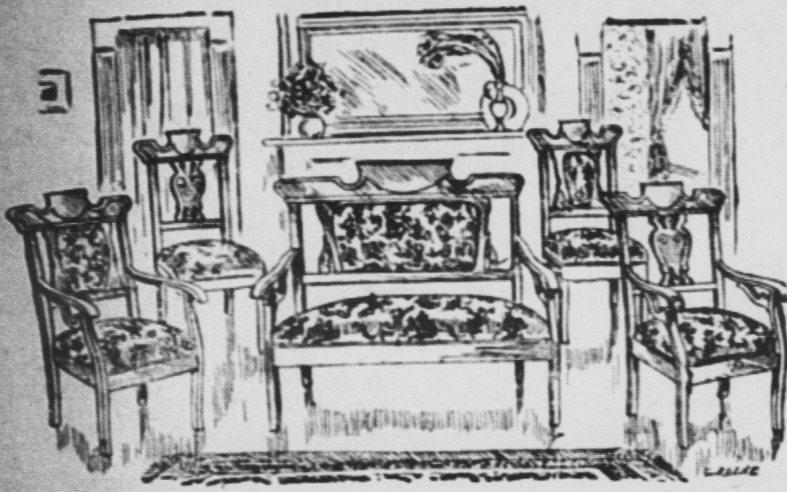

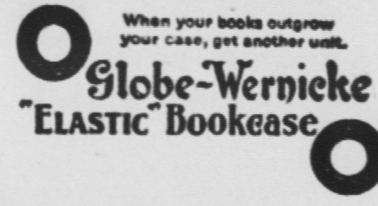

Fell Down Stairs and Sustains Broken Back—Resting Comfortably Today
Waverly—William Wellar, aged 65 years, and a life long resident of Waverly, was seriously injured Saturday night. He resides with his son-in-law James Smith in the East ward. No one was present when the accident happened. Groans were heard, and upon investigating the cause, Mr. Wellar was found lying at the bottom of the stairs down which he had apparently fallen. He was in a dazed condition bordering on unconsciousness. Dr. J. F. Tucker was called and found that the spinal column was broken just below the last rib. It is also thought that one or two ribs are broken. The portion of the body below the fracture is paralyzed. The injured man is resting comfortably today, but is unable to give any account of how the accident happened.

LINCOLN STREET HOUSE BURGLARIZED

Thieves Rummage Entire House But Secure Only \$1.25

Waverly—The residence of Burt Smith on Lincoln street was burglarized last Saturday night. Entrance was gained through a window.

thigh, had been consumed. She had been out of the penitentiary only a month, having been sent to prison on a charge of chicken stealing.

The origin of the fire is unknown. There were hints of foul play but this theory is not supported by the authorities. It is claimed that there was no fire in the stoves. It is thought that one of the drunken occupants may have dropped a lighted match or upset a lamp, the latter contention is probably the more plausible.

The scene of the fire was visited by thousands yesterday. It is one of the worst holocausts that has visited Towanda since the finding of the charred remains of Maggie Johnson and Annie Benjamin in the ruins of the former's home in Asylum township on September 18, 1904.

The authorities will conduct an investigation, but it is likely that it will never be known in what manner the fire originated.

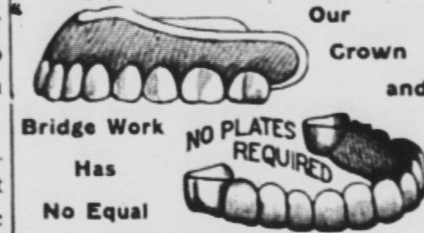

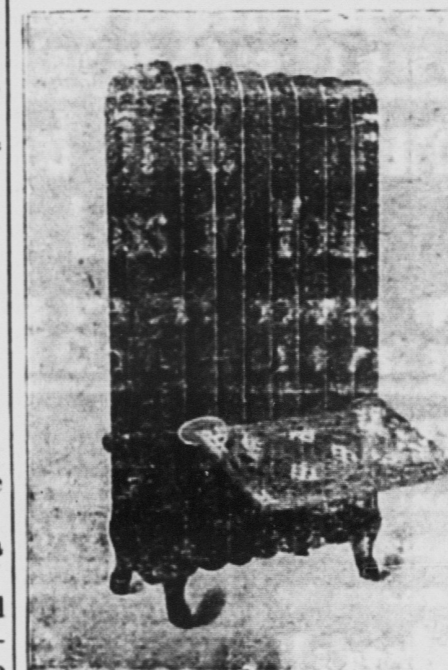
