His face and hair were singed and his shoulder had been broken by the fall. He was picked up and said that Mary Shaylor was in one of the rooms upstairs. No attention was paid to the woman but the men directed their efforts toward saving two other children which were in the house. Their efforts were successful. Jerry Decker was also in an upstairs room and he jumped from a window. He was found to be severe-
