MINING EXPERTS

MAKE TESTS

Declare That Mining Company's Find Near Athens is a Rich One

Athens—The mining experts, T. W. Perry of Avoca, Pa., and J. E. Fern of Scranton, returned to their homes last evening. They brought over some specimens of coal from the experimental test last Saturday and put them through an analysis which they say has proved that the coal is of the best, and if they find it in suitable quantities that it will be a rich mine.


A specimen 3/8 of an inch square was put through the coke test and measured 3/8 of an inch afterwards, and on increasing the heat it was entirely consumed, leaving no cinders. This, they claim, is the best coke coal in the world.

A meeting of the stockholders is called for Friday evening, and it is desired to have a full attendance. A report of this test will be made at this meeting.
