A HEART OF GOLD.

Colorado, From the Heart of the Rockies, Sent Gift to Roosevelt. WASHINGTON, Dec. 5. - A gold heart has been presented to President Roosevelt on behalf of the people of Colorado. The presentation was made by Representative Robert Bonynge of

The heart, which is of unalloyed gold. was inclosed in a handsome case bearing this inscription: "From the heart of the Rocky mountains this symbol of women and children, rich and poor sparing alike, to Theodore Roosevelt, president of the United States, whose great heart brought peace to the peo ple of Japan and Russia. Thanksgiving day, 1905, A. D."

The money to pay for the gift was raised by popular subscription, many of the subscriptions being one penny each. In all 8,000 pennies were subscribed. To these substantial subscriptions from other sources were made, so that the total amount raised aggregated several hundred dollars.

President Roosevelt expressed to Representative Bonynge his great pleasure at the receipt of the gift and desired that his cordial thanks be conveyed to the donors.
