New Isham Shell.

The new Isham shell, which, the inventor says, will sink the largest hattleship in three minutes, is being tested at the Sandy Hook proving grounds. The shell is constructed of 900 pounds of cast steel and carries and explodes a charge of 129 pounds of dynamite and nitroglycerin. It is the most powerful ever made. A 12- of the grippe. inch gun is used to fire it. The obstruction at which the explosive is aimed for the test is a piece of Harveyized steel, 12 inches thick, backed by heavy oaken timbers and a mound of sand.
