With a tremendous roar which could be heard for miles, the large acetylene gas tank that supplies the entire village of Berkshire, N. Y., with light, exploded yesterday afternoon at 2:15 o'clock. Every window in the town was shattered, of the explosion.

Berkshire is situated a few miles located in about the centre of the town on Main street. It apparentcause is given for its blowing up and had been considered safe.

A building standing on one side of the tank occupied by an undertaker's shop, a hardware and furniture store, and by Spencer Sweet, a shoemaker, was badly damaged, the entire rear portion being blown out. Mr. Sweet was badly cut about the hands.

The residence of Egbert Van-Dyke, colored, on the other side of the tank, was completely demolished. Mrs VanDyke was seriously injured but not fatally The buildings across the road were also damaged, the fronts being blown in.
