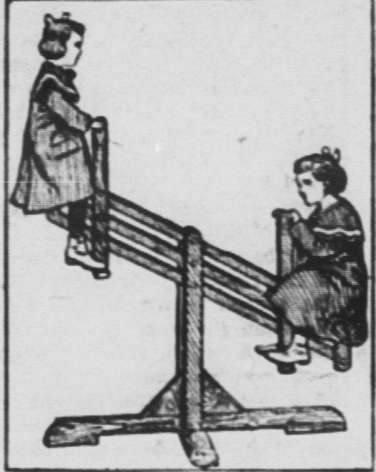

A NOVEL TOY.

See-Saw of Simple Construction, Which Has Been Patented by a Pittsburg Man.

In the accompanying engraving we illustrate a recently patented amusement device, a novel form of see-saw, the invention of a Pittsburg man, says the Scientific American. The device was designed to provide a light, simple and portable construction adapted more particularly for the entertainment and amusement of children, and for this purpose the inventor made use of the principle of the lazy-tongs, as shown by the illustration.

The central post, consisting of two similar and parallel pieces is erected upon a suitable base. In this case the longitudinal member of the base is firmly bolted between two pieces of the central post, rigidly joining it with the base, and at the same time separating the said



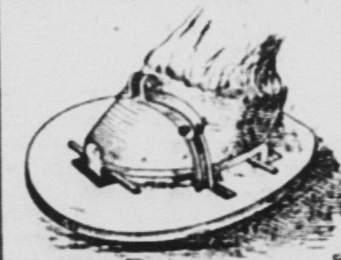

pieces at the proper distance. The cross-piece of the base may be turned about a pivot bolt into a longitudinal position, to facilitate the storing or shipping of the see-saw. Three parallel bars, the upper one shorter than the other two, are pivoted by means of bolts between the two sections of the central post. Vertical shanks carrying seats are pivoted to the two lower bars at their extremities. Two other vertical bars, pivoted to all three longitudinal bars, and at the extremities of the upper, shorter one, are provided with handle bars and foot-rests. The see-saw is shown in the drawings adapted for persons of approximately the same weight. The parallel longitudinal bars are provided with several bolt-holes so that it is possible to adjust the device for persons of varying weight by shifting the bars lengthwise upon the posts. The operation is easily understood from the illustration. The persons see-sawing when in the seats as well as in mounting and dismounting, rest their feet upon the foot-rests, and grasp the handle bars. Then to operate the see-saw it is merely necessary for the two occupants to push and pull with both hands and feet. If desired, in opposition to each other. This see-saw is simple, light and an inexpensive article, which may be easily shifted from place to place, while at the same time affording much pleasure and amusement.

SOFT GROUND HORSESHOE

Device for Aiding the Horse in Traversing Over Soft and Boggy Ground.

Quite a demand has recently arisen for soft-ground horseshoes, that is, broad, flat shoes which, owing to their large area, will prevent the feet of horses from sinking unduly into the ground. A simple shoe of this type has recently been invented, which is so designed that it can be easily reversed. The advantage of this design will be particularly felt in winter-time, as the shoe is prevented from balling up with snow. As the reversible shoe is smooth on one side, it will be found advantageous for use on horses when mowing lawns. It consists of a plate with a flange project-

ing from one face along the periphery and formed with slots to admit the calks of a horseshoe. Ribs on the plate prevent the calks from sliding back and forth on the plate. At each side a T-slot is formed to admit the head of a clamping strap. The two straps are bolted together over the hoof of the horse as shown. One of the straps is formed of two members, which are adjustably connected by means of a pin. This permits of adapting the shoe to different sizes of hoofs.

Plowing Salt.

One of the sights of the Great Salt Lake of Utah, developed by the progress of scientific industry, is the system of immense salt-making ponds on the shore of the lake. At Saltair the lake water is pumped into a great settling basin, where the impurities fall to the bottom, and, containing much iron, form a reddish deposit. From this basin the water is drawn off into "harvesting ponds," averaging 90,000 square yards in area and six inches in depth. The ponds are kept supplied with water, as the evaporation goes on from May to September, when the salt harvest begins. The water having disappeared, a dazzling layer of salt, two or three inches thick, is found covering the bottom of the ponds, which is broken up with plows before being conveyed to the mills, where the final crushing and winnowing are done.
