The Chinese newspapers say that the rowdles of the city intended to take advantage of a dispute concerning the mixed court to attack and loot the for-

eign settlements. The Japanese cruiser Tsushima and gunboat Uji have sailed for Shanghai. The reports from Shanghai all concdr in stating that the trouble has been Shoes and Slippers checked. Threats were renewed, but it does not seem likely that any attempt will be made to put them into effect owing to the strength of the landing parties, while the promised arrival of naval re-enforcements is regarded as precluding a recurrence of

the disorders The consular body will protest to the Chinese officials and demand the immediate reopening of the mixed court and the arrest of the leading agitators. A significant feature of the outbreak was that the Japanese were quite unmolested, while in certain cases they seemed to fraternize with the mob. It is becoming increasingly evident that the government at Tokyo must plainly warn Pekin against a continuance of the antiforeign movement and restrain any of its own subjects who may be injudiciously advising the Chi-

There have been some further disturbances and a few casualties. The naval forces which were landed from the warships and the volunteer guard of various nationalities, however, control the situation. The Chinese authorities also are endeavoring to suppress the disturbances.
