the scene of the fire. The office is situated at the west end of the yard. On the front, extending easterly from the office for over 100 feet along Broad street was a workshop and storeroom filled with dry lumber, doors, blinds and other materials. Back of this was an open space about 25 feet wide, and back of this space extending along the Erie tracks was a long two story shed containing several hundred thousand feet of lumber.

The cause of the fire is not own, but it originated in the fice, and in a few minutes the tire front along Broad street was flames, and within 30 minutes er the alarm was sounded the tire front fell in, and the lumber the back of the yard was in mes. The fire was so hot that oles on the opposite of the street ught fire from the heat and the 17.50 telephone and telegraph wires were melted off.

The wind was blowing a gale at the time and a shower of sparks fell all over town, some large ones being found over a half mile away. The roofs of buildings in the immediate vicinity were covered with blazing embers and had it not been for the hard rain storm several nearby buildings would have been burned.
