#### A ROUGH SURGEON.

Captain Chubb Saves a Chinese Life on the High Seas. YORK, Dec. 26. - Captain

Chubb of the steamship Satsuma, in port from Yokohama, is very much worried because owing to a rough but effective surgical operation he and the chief engineer performed on one of the Chinese sailors on the voyage he owns the sailor and all his earthly possessions, including wife and children in Hongkong. This sailor is Ling Hop. When the voyage was about half
